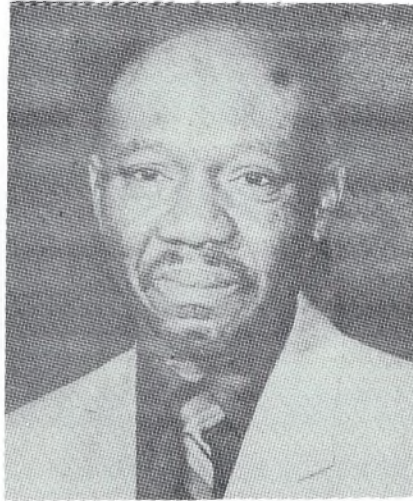

It has been said checkers have been a fascination to men since the 5th century. Many historians and archeologists have searched for the origin of checkers which many trace to India. Travelers and traders brought the knowledge of chess and checkers to Persia, Egypt and Israel. An inscription on the Temple of Thebes portrays the Egyptian King Rameses engaged in a game of checkers with one of his princes. Much later it is believed that sailors brought the game to the United States on the Nina and Santa Maria.

The origin of the American Pool Checker Association was the brain child of two men, John Oatis and Nathaniel Leach, from whom rules were made standard. A national tournament is given each year for the rating of players. Whereas we have clubs across the country and the Bahamas, hoping to better the organization year by year.
